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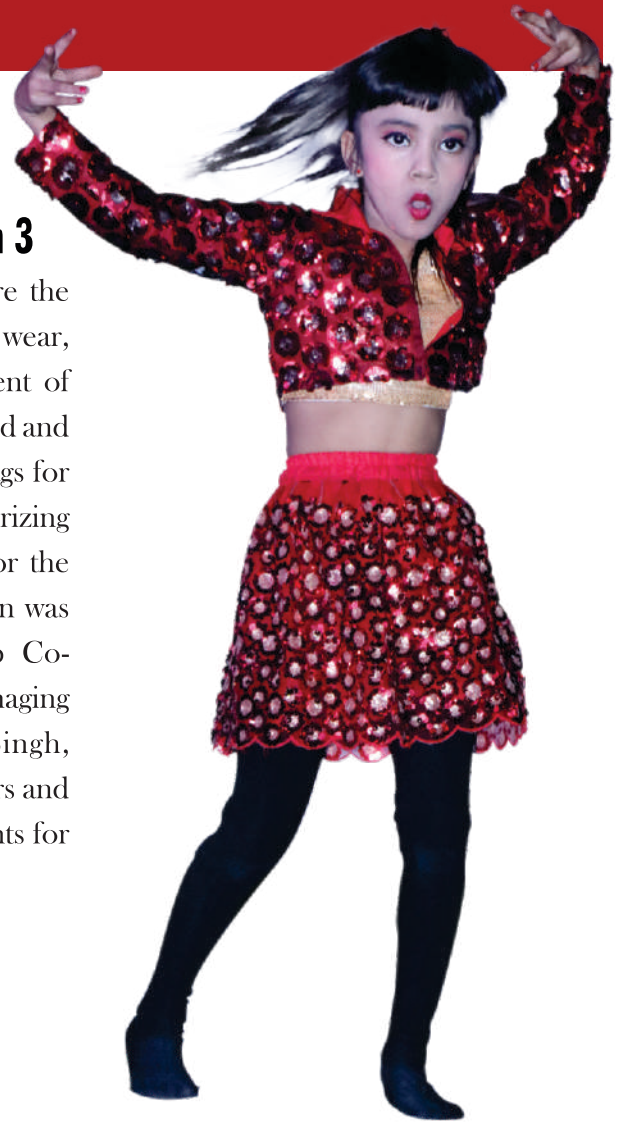
CT GROUP ORGANISES FASHION SHOW COMPETITION *Navya कृति* Season 3

As an educationist, I have been to Nagaland this week for manifold purposes including giving our message of vision and missions of CT Group of Institutions and as this period of first week of this month of December 2022 coincided with Hornbill Festival of the state of Nagaland. I had the opportunity to visit various places to the extent I could visit and am sharing with you the beautiful mountain hill festival details so that you all can also have glimpse of the multifarious cultural activities of this festival. India is known for society of multicolored, multifaceted, multilingual, multi religious, multicastric & creed and even this is the beauty of our Indian Society that it lives and moves forward with its unity in diversity. We are living in this country in different states and societies and continue to have our own faith and festivals from Kashmir to Kanyakumari including eastern and western states. In the present context, we shall be talking about

Hornbill Festival of Tribal state known as Nagaland. The Hornbill Festival is being celebrated in this state from 1st of December to 10th of December 2022. The history of this festival is known for its best of tribal music, traditional folk songs & dances, indigenous games & sports, traditional archery, Naga Wrestling, music concerts are the main attractions of this festival which is celebrated and enjoyed in peace and quietness of beautiful mountains which reflects on nature's beauty. Its being celebrated for the last 20 years. It was at the behest of Prime Minister of India that India planned to showcase Nagaland's famous Hornbill Festival when it assumes the G20 presidency on December 1, 2022. The festival began its activities with the coordination of Chief Coordinator Mr. Harsh Vardhan Shringla and the Chief Minister of Nagaland Mr. Neiphu Rio and thus, bringing it to the global scale through the lens of G20 about India's most prestigious multilateral

event to the northeastern states. Apart from the celebrations and festivities discussed above, there are some additional attractions of the festival as well. These include the following –

Tribes of Nagaland:

1. Angami - The Angamis are known for **terraced wet-rice cultivation**, because of this labor-intensive cultivation as land is the most important form of property among them.

2. Ao - They were **the first Nagas to embrace Christianity** and by virtue of this development the Aos availed themselves of the Western education that came along with Christianity.

3. Chakhesang - Chakhesang a unique tribe among the Naga family. **With diversity in its social composition, there are different dialects spoken among the Chakhesang people.**

4. Chang - They believed in a continuity between the humans, the nature and the supernatural forces. They do not worship any family, clan or village deities.

5. Dimas Kachari - The Dimas Kacharis **hunt wild animals in forest and meat is a delicacy for them.** They also catch fish in rivers and streams and they celebrate Bushu Dima festival, the most.

6. Khamniungan - Khamniungan literally translates to source of great waters. Farming is one of the primary occupations of the people of this region.

7. Konyak - The Konyaks are the largest of the Naga ethnic groups. They are **skilled in the art of making firearms**, handicrafts like basket making, cane and bamboo works, brass works etc.

8. Kuki - Kukis are **fond of music and dance.** They work hard in Jhum field, garden and enjoy dance and music at community level.

9. Lotha - Lothas are renowned for their colorful dances and folk songs.

10. Phom - **Agriculture is the traditional occupation of the Phoms, and the tribe practices jhum cultivation.** They also have a tradition of pottery, bamboo work and spinning.

11. Pochury - All the Pochuries, young and old, rich and poor, celebrate Yemshe festival with great pomp and gaiety anticipating a good harvest.

12. Rengma - The Rengmas celebrate harvest festival known as Ngada. It is an eight-day Ngada festival that marks the end of the agricultural season.

13. Sangtam - Sangtam believed in **the mystifying powers associated with natural forces like storm, fire and other natural calamities.**

14. Sumi - Sumis are known for their **bravery, nobility, generosity and their unique food habits** which contribute to the rich cultural diversity of Nagaland.

15. Tikhir - The Tikhirs are recognized as a **unique and separate Tribe with their own distinct Culture.** Tradition, Territory, History and Independent Identity.

16. Yimkhiong - They celebrate Metümnyo as this is the traditional five-day harvest festival of the Yimkhiong tribe although regarded as a solemn festival. It is celebrated after the millet crop is harvested, usually in the second week of August.

17. Zeliang - Zeliang tribe of Nagaland is one of the largest indigenous groups of the Naga community. Not just Nagaland, the Zeliang are located in the tri-junction of the states Assam, Manipur and Nagaland.

While exploring Hornbill Festival of Nagaland, I have shared with you the experiences which everyone needs in their lives to cherish the jubilating, frolic, spectacular, enthralling, mesmerizing and which almost resembles wow factor for everything I experienced at the festival. Everything in the festival including the different cultures and uniqueness like dance, hunting style, food habits of number of tribes of Nagaland including local rock bands in the festival showcased the richness of vast heritage of the state. The uniqueness of the festival can be gazed from the fact that tourists from different parts of the world both domestic and international comes to experience this festival. This year around 1 Lakh tourists witnessed this festival. I being an educationist observed that through this festival one understands more about others culture. I would like to thank, Nagaland Government, Department of tourism for giving me an opportunity to experience such an unique festival. At the utmost, I urge one and all to witness Hornbill festival, once in life time. All the five days, I spend in Hornbill festival is worth treasuring and love to visit again.
