Why is it so difficult for Punjabis to pass the IAS Exam?

The civil service allows you to put your education and experience to good use by doing something for the country and giving back to society. Srushti Jayant Deshmukh, a 23-year-old who came in fifth place in the UPSC IAS exam in 2018, said as much. Thousands of people take the civil services test each year in the hopes of becoming IAS officers. However, only a few make the final cut.

For a variety of reasons, including greater income, status, notoriety, employment security, and so on, the number of persons applying for the IAS Exam is steadily growing. The UPSC Civil Services Exam (IAS) is often considered as India's most demanding exam. This is not because the questions are tough. Of course, the IAS Preliminary, Mains, and Interview rounds do not include straightforward questions. However, due to the low selection percentage, the IAS test is tough to pass.

The competition for young aspirants is increasing at a breakneck speed. According to credible sources, more than 1 million candidates apply for the exam, which includes those for IITs, IIMs, and other famous schools. As a result, the selection is now referred to as one in a million.

Aspirants from Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, New Delhi, and other states have consistently placed high in competitive exams. Gamini Singla (UPSC), a Punjabi from Anandpur Sahib, has made us proud by scoring third in the UPSC CSE 2022 test. When compared to other large states, the number of candidates is significantly lower. In comparison to Uttar Pradesh and Bihar, the Punjab has a lesser population. Agriculture is the backbone of Punjab's economy. Punjab is a border state that is constantly on the lookout for threats. Punjab is also dedicated to acting as a custodian and a significant supply source for Indian armies. Punjabis, especially those from the Doaba area, have a deep attachment to Canada and other nations. The major reason behind this is that parents feel that we need to spend Rs. 15-25 lakh on a child in order for him to settle well in a foreign nation and finally take care of his family in India. The other difficulty is that, regardless of their family's annual income, individuals want to live a healthy and prosperous life.

Candidates from other states, notably Bihar, may not have nearly as many alternatives when it comes to finding work. These candidates have distinct desires than Punjabi aspirants. Govind Jaiswal, a Varanasi native and son of a rickshaw driver, did not allow himself any other option except success throughout his preparatory days, when he even skipped meals to save money, to quote. He never wavered in his focus, though. In 2006, Jaiswal scored 48 on his first attempt in the IAS test. Beno Zephine also made history in 2005 when he was the first blind candidate to be admitted into the Indian Foreign Service (IFS).

The Punjab government and many educational institutions have made several attempts to promote knowledge about these difficult tests, and it is hoped that fresh candidates would emerge to take the civil services exam.

Therefore, it is a great news that now students of CT University will study half of their course from CTU campus and the other half from the University of North

Alabama, USA. Students will not have to take any TOFEL/IELTS test or GRE/GMAT etc. In this case students will be selected on the basis of the marks obtained in the studies conducted here. In addition, students will be offered housing scholarship while studying in the United States, so

students only will pay for fees and meals. University of North Alabama also offers CTU students academic scholarship of \$8000 of being Partner University and it will be continued depending upon the student's performance in the consecutive years at University of North

Alabama. The collaboration is aimed to explore other international cooperation initiatives of mutual interest to further enhance educational excellence and opportunities at both universities. Rajan, Official Representative, University of North Alabama said, "We are delighted that through CT University we are paving the way for students to pursue higher education in the United States. In this way students will also avoid money laundering and by doing half study here it will be clear what their real goal is."

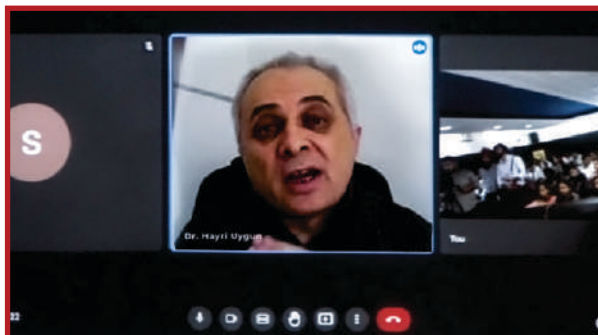
