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CT Group Commemorates
**Shri Guru

555th Birth Year**
by Planting **555 Trees**
Using **Miyawaki Technique**

In honor of the 555th birth year of Shri Guru Nanak Dev Ji, the CT Group family planted 555 plants, creating a micro-forest at its Shahpur campus. This plantation was executed using the Miyawaki technique, pioneered by Japanese botanist Akira Miyawaki, which fosters rapid growth and denser forests by planting dozens of native species in the same area. The Miyawaki approach ensures plant growth is 10 times faster and 30 times thicker than usual, becoming maintenance-free after the first three years. These plantations are expected to cool the surrounding temperature by at least 5 degrees

Celsius, countering high temperatures, global warming, and water level reductions. Special thanks to the Green Punjab Mission Team for partnering with us on this initiative. The plants have been adopted by all stakeholders of CT Group, who will ensure their growth and maintenance. 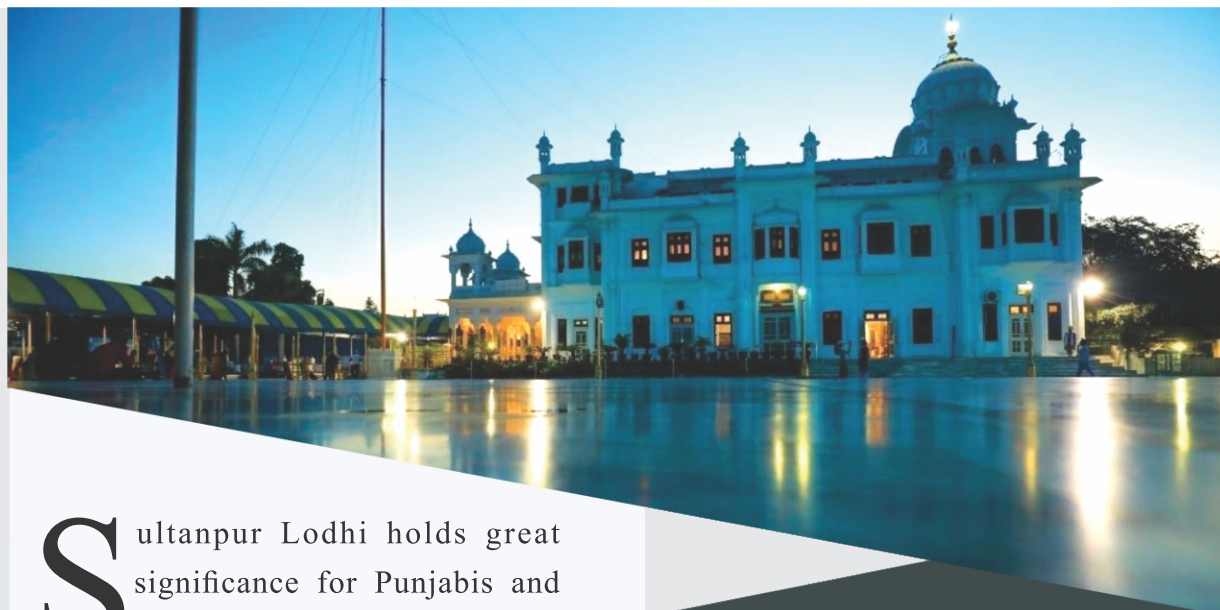
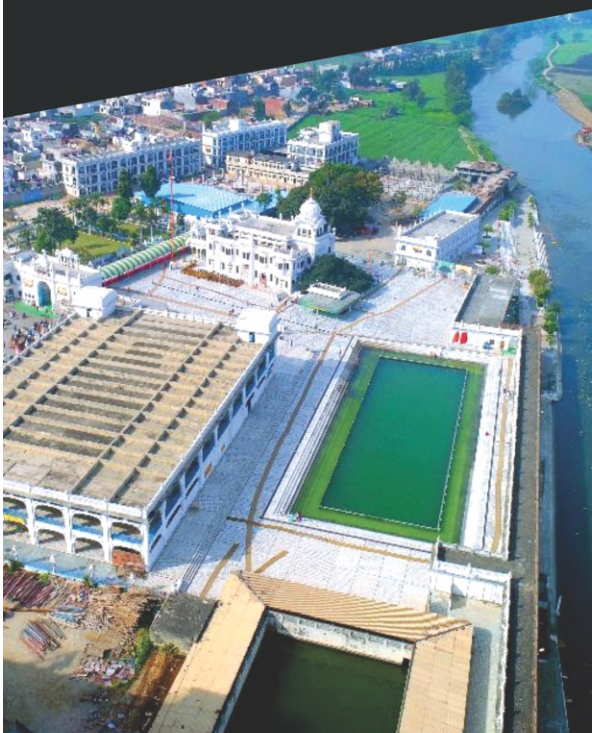

A Sacred Haven in Sikh History



Sultanpur Lodhi holds great significance for Punjabis and Sikhs as a holy pilgrimage site closely linked to the life and teachings of Guru Nanak Dev Ji. Architecture of Gurudwara Ber Sahib

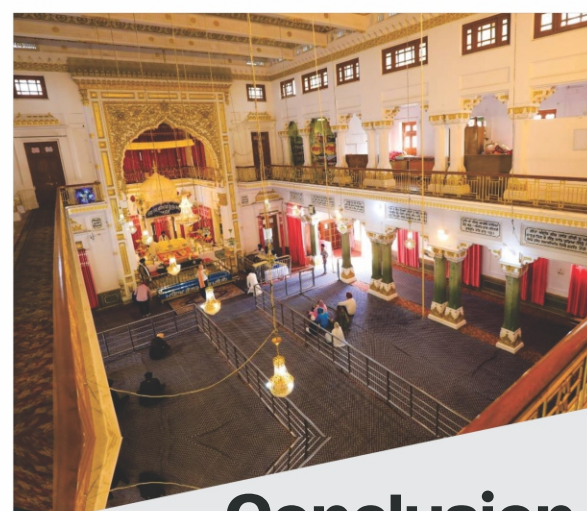
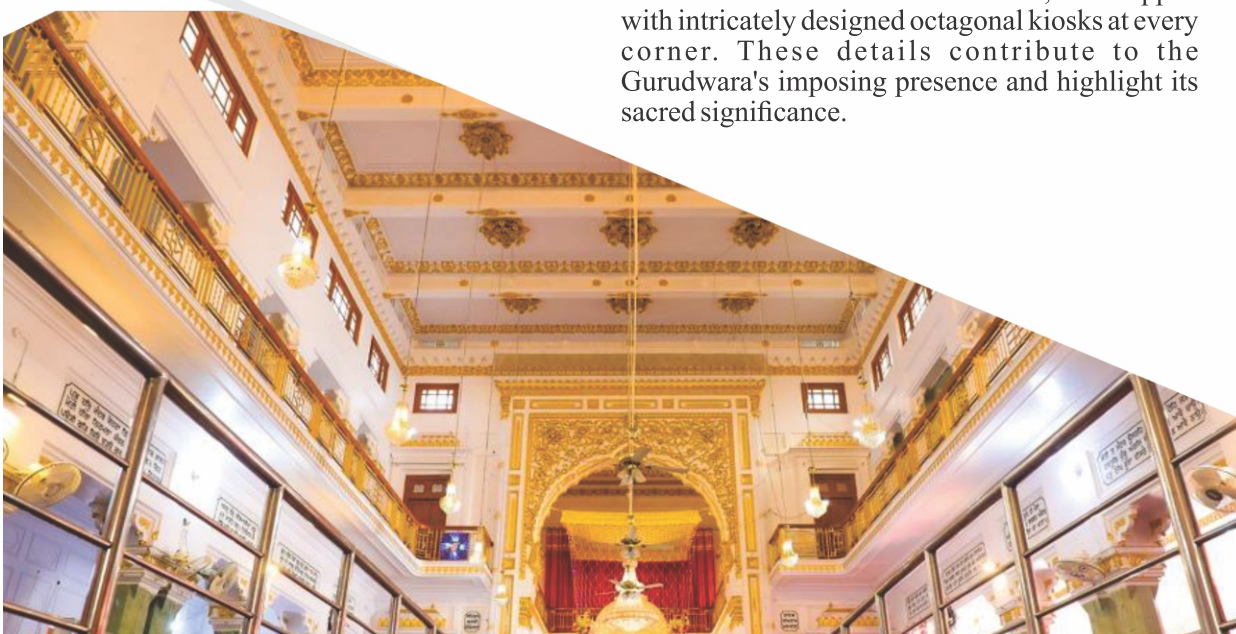
Gurudwara Ber Sahib is an impressive four-storey cruciform building with a modest basement beneath the parkash asthan, the sacred space where the Guru Granth Sahib is revered. Visitors enter from the south through a grand three-bay portico with octagonal columns, leading into the Gurudwara's foyer.

At the heart of the Gurudwara is the parkash asthan, situated in the center of a spacious hall and sheltered by an elegant white marble canopy called a palki. This sacred space is the focal point for devotion and spiritual reflection.

The Gurudwara's design is meticulously planned to create a harmonious and sacred atmosphere. The first floor's layout mirrors that of the ground floor, ensuring symmetry and balance.

The hall's side bays function as galleries, extending outward and cantilevering towards the central triple-height component, enhancing the interior's visual grandeur. Decorative elements such as square kiosks on the corners and a majestic chhatri above the entry portico add to the Gurudwara's ornate beauty. These features not only enhance the aesthetic but also reflect Sikhism's spiritual and cultural heritage.

The Gurudwara's exterior features octagonal columns that rise to the terrace level, each topped with intricately designed octagonal kiosks at every corner. These details contribute to the Gurudwara's imposing presence and highlight its sacred significance.
